Median household income is \$21.2K below the national median household income of \$62.8K.

Takeaways

- As of 2020 the region's population **increased by 1.7**% since 2015, growing by 392. Population is expected to **increase by 4.6**% between 2020 and 2025, adding 1,053.
- From 2015 to 2020, jobs declined by 3.0% in McDonald County, MO from 8,309 to 8,063. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 1.3% by 4.3%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate increased from 56.7% to 60.0% between 2015 and 2020.
- Concerning educational attainment, **8.0% of McDonald County, MO residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (12.1% below the national average), and **6.2% hold an Associate's Degree** (2.4% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2020 are Animal Slaughtering and Processing, Animal Production, and Education and Hospitals (Local Government).






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity





Job Trends




Unemployment Rate Trends


Millennials

McDonald County, MO has 4,072 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 4,709.




1,559Veterans

McDonald County, MO has 1,559 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 1,268.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is about average in McDonald County, MO. The national average for an area this size is 6,714 people 55 or older, while there are 6,737 here.




Violent Crime

Racial diversity is low in McDonald County, MO. The national average for an area this size is 9,109 racially diverse people, while there are 5,297 here.




Property Crime








Top Growing Industries






Top Industry LQ





Top Industry GRP

















2020 Median Hourly Earnings






